



Privacy Notice – Publishing Pupils’ Coursework

Publishing Pupils' Coursework

Discovery Educational Trust (DET) and its Schools may wish to celebrate the achievements of pupils and promote the Trust/School through the publication of coursework. When this is the case, DET/its Schools seek the consent of the parent/carer, or, where pupils are aged 12 or above, from the pupil themselves. As reliance is placed on your consent, you can withdraw consent at any time by contacting the relevant School Office. Every effort is made to delete the coursework, but please note that, where consent has been provided for the publication, DET and its Schools may be unable to locate and delete the coursework on request, although reasonable steps are taken to do so.

Where consent has been provided for the use of coursework, and the pupil has left the school, DET/its Schools rely on Legitimate Interests as the legal basis when retaining coursework for promotional purposes. If you would like a copy of the Legitimate Interest Assessment for this activity, please contact the relevant School Office.

The personal information likely to be used in this activity is:

- Pupil name;
- School year;
- Coursework.

Each DET School is the Data Controller for this information. The information might be shared with:

- Other pupils;
- Social Media applications;
- Trust/School website providers.

No coursework is routinely available outside of the UK. However, where it is used on Social Media, in publications, or on DET/School websites, access cannot be restricted to the UK.
