

Escalation Process (Examinations) 2023/24

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1. Purpose of the Process

In terms of internal governance arrangements, it is the responsibility of the Head of Centre to ensure that either Chase High School (CHS) or St. Martin's School (SMS) has in place a written escalation process should the Head of Centre, or a member of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) with oversight of examination administration, be absent.

This process confirms the main duties and responsibilities to be escalated.

This process also supports CHS and SMS ability to confirm to an Awarding Body, the external governance arrangements in order that the Awarding Body has confidence in the integrity of Centre activities, such as the delivery of qualifications and the conducting of examinations and assessments.

2. Before Examinations (Planning)

In the event of the absence of the Head of Centre or the Deputy Headteacher responsible for examinations, responsibility for implementing Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ) regulations and requirements relating to activity prior to examinations is escalated to another member of SLT.

3. Before Examinations (Entries and Pre-Examinations)

In the event of the absence of the Head of Centre or the Deputy Headteacher responsible for examinations, responsibility for implementing JCQ regulations and requirements relating to entries and exam preparation is escalated to another member of SLT.

To support understanding of the regulations and requirements, sections of relevant JCQ publications are specifically referenced, including:

- General Regulations for Approved Centres (Section 5);
- Instructions for conducting examinations (Sections 1-15);
- Access Arrangements and Reasonable Adjustments (Sections 6-8).

Main Duties and Responsibilities

The main duties and responsibilities relate to:

- Entries: (including ensuring appropriate controls are in place, which allow accurate entries to be submitted to the Awarding Bodies)

4. During Examinations (Examination Time)

In the event of the absence of the Head of Centre or the Deputy Headteacher responsible for examinations, responsibility for implementing JCQ regulations and requirements relating to during examination time is escalated to another member of SLT.

The Centre also has in place a member of the SLT, who provides support and guidance to the Examinations Officer and ensures that the integrity and security of examinations and assessments are maintained throughout an examination series. 5. After Examinations (Results and Post-Results)

As a contingency to enable the prompt handling of urgent issues only, the Centre responds to the Awarding Bodies' request for information regarding the contact details of a senior member of staff (which might include a personal mobile number and/or email address). This ensures that any urgent matters, which arise outside of term time, which might adversely affect candidates, and which potentially put qualification awards at risk, can be addressed by Awarding Bodies with the support of that member of staff. The Head of Centre ensures that this member of staff has the necessary authority to mobilise resources to provide this support, which might include resolving issues within the Centre itself (GR 5.3)

In the event of the absence of the Head of Centre or the Deputy Headteacher responsible for examinations, responsibility for implementing JCQ regulations and requirements relating to after examinations is escalated to another member of SLT.
